gaunt GAHNT ADJECTIVE

very thin and bony in appearance, as from hunger or illness [As the grass died from lack of rain, the cattle became gaunt.]

hue HYOO NOUN

a color or a shade of a color [Maria gave the fabric a lovely hue by soaking it in tea.]

idle EYE • dul

ADJECTIVE 1. not active or working [There is a lot to do, so none of us can be idle.]

ADJECTIVE 2. lazy; unwilling to work [Our idle neighbor won't look for a job.]

VERB 1. to do no work [Tomorrow I plan just to idle away the hours.]

VERB 2. to run a motor while it is not in gear [If you let the car idle awhile, it will warm up.]
